Online Safety Message

As part of our work with the Lincoln-area safeguarding network, we have been made aware of an app called ooVoo and we have some concerns which we wanted to bring to your attention.

ooVoo lets the user make video and voice calls, send texts and video chat with up to 12 people. However, the default setting for the app is public, which means that anyone can access an individual's profile/account. It is also very easy to search for individual names and any other names linked to an individual's account.

It has been reported to us that, even when a young person has the right privacy settings, unknown individuals have been making friend requests but using the name of that young person's friend. So a young person might think that they are accepting a request from someone they know when, in fact, it is an unknown individual. Once the friend request has been accepted, you cannot block that individual and reporting anything on the site is extremely difficult.

Unfortunately, we have been made aware that some young people who have accepted requests from people they thought were friends have then been sent indecent images, videos and been bombarded with calls, all of which they are unable to block.

We strongly advise that young people do not use ooVoo and we would urge you to speak with your child about the potential risks of this app.

Next Year's Focus

Our focus next year across the school will be to truly embrace nurture across the setting.

The concept of nurture highlights the importance of social environments - who you're with, and not who you're born to and its significant influence on behaviour and cognitive ability. Children and young people who have a good start in life have a whole host of advantages over those who don't have such positive experiences at home when they are little. They tend to do better at school, attend regularly, enjoy activities with friends and are significantly less likely to offend or experience problems with poor physical or mental health. Nurture groups offer an opportunity to learn the early nurturing experiences some children and young people lack, giving them the skills to do well at school, make friends and deal more confidently and calmly with the trials and tribulations of life, for life.

The 6 principal of Nurture are:-

- 1. Children's learning is understood developmentally
 - 2. The classroom offers a safe base
- 3. The importance of nurture for the development of wellbeing
 - 4. Language is a vital means of communication
 - 5. All behaviour is communication
 - 6. The importance of transition in children's lives

INSET Dates 2017/18


Inset Days: these will primarily be during term time, on a Friday,
