
The students are really enjoying it which is evidenced through their positive attitude to learning, their behaviour and of course their smiles ©

Primary 1

This term in P1 our topic has been Enchanted Forest so we have been looking at all things magical. We have created our own Gingerbread Man from the gingerbread fairy-tale, made rice crispy cakes from Hansel and Gretel and made lots of art using different resources from the woods like leaves and sticks!







We have also done some cooking, which we really enjoyed doing and eating. The children concentrated very hard!

Primary 2

This term, in maths we have been learning about fractions and how we can show these in different ways. We used Numicon, Lego and Magnetix to help show a variety of different fractions.

We have learnt some very interesting facts and know all about the Richter scale now. We have been making buildings strong enough to survive an earthquake, and have worked well as both individuals and in pairs/teams. This term our Inquiry question was 'Why should we save our planet?' We have learned about how much plastic is in the ocean, how much plastic each street in the UK uses, the

creatures in the ocean that it affects. We learned about deforestation because of palm oil. We learned that palm oil is disguised as vegetable oil in foods and is used in shampoos, washing liquids and soap. We have looked at the forest animals and how it is affecting the orangutans and we are making our own set of top trump cards of the animals affected in the rainforest. We have looked at persuasive words and have written to Tesco

and Hugh Fearnley-Whittingstall about why we agree that Tesco should get rid of their single use plastic.

We have really enjoyed our visits to bushcraft where we have learned to make fires, make bread, burn bread (!), make stew

and bolognese. We also started making shelters.

We've made cheesecake, rocky road and fairy cakes in cooking.

The new school building is really big. We like that there are better activity options for break times and the shared areas that we can use. We are looking forward to being able to use the gym in September.

Our inquiry question next half term is 'Do our choices really matter?'






for Secondary 2 earning lots of rewards for our excellent manners, team work and the gift of song (although, Mrs Rawding and Miss
